1.0 Purpose and objectives of the Fisherfolk Community of Practice


The Key objectives for the CoP are:

- 1. Economic Empowerment of the members
- 2. Surveillance, Monitoring and Evaluation to reduce insecurity and accidents
- 3. To promote good healthy living and wellbeing of the members

2.0 Coordination Structure

BMU establishment and operationalization is governed by the Fisheries Act. It spells out the mandate, membership and role of each office as per the structure. There are two key coordination structures that include Executive Committee and Assembly. The executive Committee has membership of 9-15 members. The Membership include; Boat owners 30%; Crews 30%; traders 10%; others 30%. The Executive committee has Chairperson, Deputy Chairperson, Secretary, Treasurer and committee members. The Assembly is composed of; all Executive committee members, registered members and other.
