





YOUTH ADVISORY CHAMPIONS OF HEALTH (YACH) CHARTER

1.0 Background:

Youth Advisory Champions of Health **(YACH)**, is an adolescent and youth program that aims at HIV prevention, formally known as YAC- Youth Advisory Council. It was formed to increase youth involvement in matters concerning them, "nothing

about us without us". The first batch of champions

was trained in 2018 and was a group of 15 which has grown to 40 Youth Ambassadors who assist in creating awareness among the Youth drawn from the 12 sub counties of Kiambu.



2.0 Goal and Objectives (What, why, When)

Goal: advocating for mental health, HIV, GBV, SRH among adolescents & young persons aged (15-24 years) in Kiambu County:

(Thika, Juja, Gatundu (North & South), Ruiru, Githunguri, Kiambu, Kiambaa, Kabete, Kikuyu, Limuru, Lari sub counties).

Objectives: (How) – sensitization in schools, RFM community radio platforms, social media campaigns, Jaba/Miraa Base

- 1. Creating awareness through Sensitization forums outreaches, tournaments
- 2. Provision of Information on Sexual Reproductive Health
- 3. Provision of Entrepreneur skills, self-employment and IGAs
